# Master's Programme in International Security Management

## New M.A. Programme starting in April 2018

<b>Degree</b>	Master of Arts (M.A), 120 ECTS credit points
<b>Objectives &amp; Content</b>	Security is a crucial topic for private and public actors, including business, governments and NGOs, and has both national and international dimensions. The new M.A. International Security Management aims to prepare students for careers in international security management by helping them to develop the critical interdisciplinary understanding and practically-oriented skills relevant for an evolving and fast-paced industry.
<b>Organisation</b>	The M.A. International Security Management begins in April and takes place over four academic semesters (2 years), Students will usually spend Semester 3 undertaking an internship. The M.A. programme is taught entirely in English.
<b>Admission Requirements</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• An internationally recognised undergraduate degree (Bachelor, Diploma), with at least 180 ECTS credit points</li><li>• Very good knowledge of English (equivalent to Level B2 of Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR) for Languages)</li><li>• CV and letter of motivation</li></ul>
<b>Fees</b>	There are no tuition fees for this programme. Students are required to pay a semester fee for each semester of study. This is currently € 303.39. The semester fee includes a ticket for Berlin public transport.
<b>Cost of Living</b>	Students are responsible for paying their own living costs. The German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD) estimates that a student requires a monthly budget of € 864 to study in Germany
